**Altar Servers' Mass with the Bishop** takes place on 11<sup>th</sup> October in the Cathedral. Would any servers like to attend? Any help for transport?

**19<sup>th</sup> October** we have a combined evening service in English Martyrs' Church Bakewell. The other Bakewell church communities will be joining us at 6pm for evening prayer. Deacon John will arrange this service and we hope that our choir along with our parishioners will help with the celebration.

**A View from the Inside this time:** a Parishioner writes: - 'isn't it hard to sing together without a lead from the organ and the choir! Without the choir mistress, the choir too would find it hard to keep time and sing together. I think it is the same with the Mass texts we say together, e.g. the *Confiteor*, the *Credo* and the *Lord's Prayer*. The celebrant leads us in these prayers, helping us to observe the appropriate pauses, etc. Pope Pius X wrote: *If you wish to hear the Mass as it should be heard, you must follow with eye, heart and mouth all that happens at the altar. Further, you must pray with the celebrant the holy words said by him in the name of Christ and which Christ says by him. You have to associate your heart with the holy feelings that are contained in these words and in this manner you ought to follow all that happens at the altar. When acting in this way, you have prayed the Holy Mass.*' (On behalf of the Liturgy Committee)

**From the House of Commons** in a letter dated 28<sup>th</sup> August Jim Dobbin MP, Lord Alton and Ann Widdecombe MP remind us that the amendments to the *Human Fertilisation & Embryology Bill* are still being strongly debated behind the scenes. We are urged to contact our MPs to register our protests about this Bill becoming law.
