Parish Money Matters are always interesting and catch the eyes of all who read the bulletin including visiting priests! Our regular parishioners know the parish system but we have a few new ones. Our main source of income is the weekly/monthly commitment of parishioners to the support of the parish which is "our parish". We average 135 people attending the three weekend Masses – two in Bakewell (60-70 people) and one in Hassop (55-65 people). Parish income is given through (1) the weekly envelope scheme (can be gift aided), (2) loose plate (cannot be gift aided) and (3) direct debit arrangement with your bank (can be gift aided). The easiest way for the parish is using the direct debit method because the parish receives your offering even when you are away enjoying the sunshine somewhere else! It is also an easy system to administer. The weekly/monthly envelope system requires a little administration and it does help if we use a regular envelope for this. If you need expert advice to go further, please ask Gerry Smith or Tony Byrne. Once again, I would like to say 'thank you' to all who help and support the parish in any way because, without such support, we would certainly grind to a halt. Fr Hugh
