On the Fridays of Advent (beginning next Friday) there will a modest experiment with something "new" for us. Peter Peel will lead a 15 minutes or so "**Lectio Divina**" in the parish rooms. Soup will be available for those who would like to remain on and donations can be offered for a charity that will be determined a little later on.

With the opening of the Advent Season, please note we follow **Year B** for the Sunday cycle and our parish Advent Reconciliation service is planned for Saturday, **10th December** at 11.00am in Hassop.
