Diary of the month:

26th Parish Finance Committee meets at 7.30pm

Next Weekend Diocesan 2nd collection for *Sick & Retired Priests' Fund*. Every year we are asked to help with this. Information leaflets & gift aid envelopes are available in both churches.

30th R E Group meets c/o Jane at 5.15 to 6.15pm and the February meeting takes place on 27th Feb.

This past week we had meetings of the St Vincent de Paul (SVP), Eucharistic Ministers, the Social Committee and the Parish Pastoral Council. The EMs' meeting finished with a quiet time of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in the church. Thanks are offered to all who attended the meetings and to those who sent apologies because they could not make it.

The SVP members had their normal business meeting and, then, discussed a suggestion from the ecumenical gathering we had in Hassop last November ... Do you remember *"Living our Vision"*? A suggestion about a more ecumenical membership/supporters is under review.

The Eucharistic Ministers looked at the practicalities of their ministry and were reminded that each communicant is expected to say their **"Amen"** loud and clear at the time of receiving the Body and the Blood of Christ in Sacrament. Also, the frequency of morning Holy Communion Services was discussed. It is rare that we have nobody for the weekday Mass but occasionally there is nobody apart from the celebrant. It can be the same for the weekday Holy Communion service. We decided to stay with the present custom of no Holy Communion services on Monday mornings (though there will frequently be Mass then) and maintain the present arrangement of Communion services on Tues., Wed., Thurs. and Fridays when there is no Mass. However, we shall be monitoring this arrangement and change it if we have to.

The PPC gave considerable time to the Bishop's document *"Living Stones"* which plans for future needs of the Diocese and parishes. This will get more attention during Lent when there will be a pastoral letter on the topic. Also, a "light hearted" discussion group is being planned although the topics will be important for all who build their lives on a faith response to God's call.

The Social Committee discussed dates and activities including something about the time of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee in early June. A calendar of dates & events is being prepared ... so we'll have no excuses!!

In the light of the above, *"The Lord needs you. The Church needs you. Have you noticed that almost all the people who are active in the parish are retired, elderly even? We are regularly invited to give a personal response to helping the parish. Do you remember the young Samuel of last Sunday's reading who said, 'Here I am, Lord!'"*

The RCIA plans for the Diocese have been announced by the Catechetics coordinators. RCIA stands for *Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults* so it is adult focused. If any adult who participates in parish life but does not take the Sacraments but would like to, please have a quiet word with Fr Hugh so that we can go forward on it.
