Today's Gospel is a story of devotion and repentance, but a story also of the welcome of and hospitality given to Jesus. He does not rebuke the sinner or interrogate her. He sets no pre-conditions, demands no promise of improvement. The details of her sin are unimportant to him; the heartfelt repentance is all that matters. Of all the evangelists Luke especially stores up stories of the return of sinners. In contrast with Jesus and the woman stands the host at the dinner-party, Simon the Pharisee. Simon is not evil, but is a stickler for the observance of the Law, and is judgmental of others. However, Jesus is attentive to Simon as well: he gives him a question he can answer so that Jesus can affirm him; then Jesus points out Simon's shortcomings, then gently but firmly offering to Simon too the opportunity for repentance.
