**Louise Cooke** (Diocesan J & P Rep.) writes: 'The staggering rise in the numbers of people using food banks is down to failings in the benefit system, too many low paid jobs and rising prices that are dragging huge numbers into poverty. This was the finding of a report in May by *Church Action On Poverty* and *Oxfam* which suggested up to half of those seeking help were doing so as a direct result of having benefit payments delayed, reduced or withdrawn.'
