The Parish Social Committee met last Tuesday and reviewed the social events of parish life last year. The Committee has worked very hard and kept us moving towards events but we all admitted it is getting harder each year. We would love to have some younger parishioners joining the Committee. Last year our fund raising events brought in over £9,000.00 for the parish's finances, which is an excellent achievement for those who plan the events and those who support them. Thank you all! However, after some discussion we concluded that 2 quiz evenings and 2 barbecues are really too many for the Committee to handle and to promote in the parish. These events will be reduced to one event each in future. John Hampson who has very generously coordinated our raffle ticket arrangements for the Summer & Christmas Fairs is no longer able to continue because of family illness. Our thanks go to John and to Rosemary for their help and support in the parish by serving on the Committee. Obviously, we will need to find somebody to take over from John and to look after this little corner for us.

Parish Finance Committee met on Tuesday evening and looked at the overall financial picture plus the correspondence that has come our way. The Treasurer told the Committee that our weekly/monthly/annual income through Offertory contributions is down on last year. This may be due to the fact that three parishioners have died: between them, they gave over £3,000.00 per annum. This is a noticeable loss for the parish finances especially if this downward trend continues. If anybody has any ideas about what could be done to improve the situation, please make suggestions to Fr Hugh who will discuss them with the Treasurer and Finance Committee members. Many thanks!
