'On May 1st 1987, during my pastoral visit to Germany, I had the joy of beatifying this generous witness to the faith in the city of Cologne. Today, 11 years later, here in Rome ... I am able to solemnly present this daughter of Israel and faithful daughter of the Church as a saint to the whole world. Today, as then, we bow to the memory of Edith Stein, proclaiming the indomitable witness she bore during her life and especially by her death.' [Homily of Pope John Paul II in 1998] Edith joined the Carmelite Convent of Cologne on 14 October, and her investiture took place on 15 April, 1934 and took the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross: she was arrested by the Gestapo on 2 August 1942, while she was in the chapel with the other sisters. She was to report within five minutes to officers, together with her sister Rosa, who had also converted and was serving at the Echt Convent. Edith's last words to be heard in Echt were addressed to Rosa: "Come, we are going for our people." It was probably on 9 August that Sister Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, her sister Rosa and many other of her people were gassed in Auschwitz. Her feast day is on 9th August (this Saturday). She was baptised in 1922 (aged 31) and joined the Carmelite Order in 1933 – a contemplative community.
