Some of you will know already that **CAFOD** is undergoing a re-organising of its main London office but it still depends heavily on local volunteers. Gift Aid envelopes are available for **CAFOD** and are attached to the newsletter for the 2nd collection.

Next Friday Lent Mass with short Way of the Cross meditation and soup for all who can make it. Don't be afraid to come along for only one of these Lent moments. Donations can be left for the *Sierra Leone Street Children*. We still need some 'soup makers'. Don't be shy!

Next Sunday is 1st Sunday of March – Mass times as above. After Mass in Bakewell, we'll have another fund raising event for our Lourdes pilgrims, Solomon & Thomas. Last Sunday parishioners donated their 100 Club prize of £75.00 to the fund and another parishioner has given £50.00. So, the fund now stands at £420.23p. Costs for both our pilgrims will be about £1,000.00 so we have a little way to travel still. If you want them to clean your cars, clean your windows, do your shopping or get them involved in the lambing season, just give them a call and they should come running fast! We are now getting ready to follow plan B for Solomon who will join other young pilgrims from Nottingham Diocese.
