Housekeeping Rules (1) If you open a door, then lock it afterwards – don’t presume somebody else will lock it for you! One door was left open last week. (2) If you use a kettle, make sure you switch it off – again last week one kettle was left on, no water in it and the element burnt. (3) **Taps and lights** – if you use, please make sure you close or switch off after use. Timers are used when necessary so there is no need to leave lights on. (4) **Bins** – food waste goes in a food waste bag (found in downstairs kitchen) and put in the small ‘caddy’: other waste goes in a bin bag. Do not put **plastics** of any kind (including wrappings) in the green bin – these go in the **blue bin** along with bottles, cardboard, papers, tins, etc The **black bin** is used for general waste: rubbish for this bin is put into bin bags before placing in the bin. It should not be necessary to move rubbish from one bin to another – but it happens ... and who has to do it???? Yes, you’ve got in one!
