On 1st Tuesday of Advent (1st Dec.) we begin our special effort at some Advent prayer. We'll have a short evening prayer beginning at 7.00pm and Annemarie is arranging for this. Our prayer finishes in time for choir practice. New choir members are always welcome especially for the Advent Season.
