Ukraine: At the end of Mass in St Peter's Square on Sunday 3rd April, Pope Francis launched a humanitarian initiative for the people of Ukraine, in the form of a **special collection** to be taken in all Catholic churches in Europe on **Sunday 24th April**: 'I think in particular, here in Europe, of the drama of those who suffer the consequences of the violence in Ukraine, of those who remain in lands devastated by hostilities that have already claimed thousands of lives, and of all those, over a million, who have been displaced as a result of the grave ongoing situation there. The affected are primarily the elderly and children. In addition to accompanying them in my constant thought and prayers, I wish to promote humanitarian aid for them. A special collection for this cause will be held in all the Catholic churches throughout Europe on Sunday 24th April. I invite the faithful to participate in this initiative by contributing generously. This gesture of charity, as well as alleviating material suffering, will also express to Ukraine my personal closeness and that of the Church as a whole. I strongly hope that this will promote peace and respect for rights, without further delays, in this sorely-tried land.'

Bishop Patrick would like a second collection to be taken at all Masses celebrated in the Diocese of Nottingham on the evening of Saturday 23rd April and on Sunday 24th April, the Fifth Sunday of Easter.

Association of Bakewell Christians The Bakewell Community Project - Building Bridges Asylum seekers, refugees and us Bakewell and surrounding areas response to the Refugee crisis in Europe

Around thirty people attended a meeting convened by the ABC at the Friends Meeting House on Saturday 5th March to discuss how Bakewell can respond to the immigrant and refugee crisis in Europe. Tom Reavey and Anne Hollow, two volunteers who had just returned from Lesbos spoke movingly about the trauma experienced by those arriving there by boat from Turkey. This was followed by a discussion, introduced by Sarah Eldridge from Sheffield City of Sanctuary, about what we, in Bakewell and surrounding areas might do to respond to the needs of asylum It was agreed by attendees from across the denominations that there would be five working groups to take forward Bakewell's proposed response. These will focus on the following areas:

- **Advocacy** highlighting the facts about the situation of asylum seekers and refugees and advocating changes to alleviate the difficulties they face.
- **Collections** of clothes (particularly 30/32 inch waist) including trousers for males; outdoor wear; old mobile phones; and bikes.
- Fund Raising in a variety of ways.
- **Hospitality** offering asylum seekers short stays in Bakewell.
- Language teaching to help improve the English language skills of asylum seekers and refugees.

Each of these groups at the meeting began to plan what action they might take in the future.

It was suggested that some people may have an initiative of their own.
