This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord. It takes precedence over Sunday. It reminds us of the experience of the apostles on the mountain with the Lord – the mystery of glorification at the end of trials and pain. It was on this Feast that Pope Paul VI died in 1978. It was also a Sunday in that year.

Please note that we have morning Mass each day Monday- Friday with times as above. Attendance is optional, of course, but the Eucharist is the "source and summit" of the life of the Church on its pilgrim way. Do we hunger for it?

Many thanks to our young parishioners who did so well last Sunday for the last 'youth Mass' until September. They are a credit to the organisers and to those who give their support. We hope to keep this monthly practice in September and hope more parents will become involved.

August happenings:

8th Wedding preparations in presbytery

9th Bi-centenary working group meets in presbytery as arranged. The fruit of their deliberations will be offered to the PPC whose next meeting is planned for 7th September.

11th Friday morning Mass for Monica & Ron Hickie both of whom have recently celebrated their Birthdays.

14th Vigil Mass for Solemnity of the Assumption at 6.15pm in Bakewell.

15th Morning Mass for the Assumption at 10.00am in Hassop. The Assumption remains a Holy Day of Obligation for us and all who can are obliged to attend Mass. When we celebrated Ss Peter & Paul, a parishioner asked Fr Hugh, 'Why make these feasts obligatory? Can't we self-regulate?' The answer might be found when we ask ourselves how well do we self-regulate other things we are expected to do.

19 – 20th We welcome Fr John Gerrard will visit the parish and make the annual missionary appeal on behalf of the Missionaries of Africa (better known as the White Fathers). He will stay overnight in the presbytery and celebrate the weekend Masses.

30th or 31st Hassop flower group meeting in the presbytery at 2.00pm. A number of parishioners and regular visitors to the parish have been contacted so that some support can be offered to Liz Marsh who has attended to church flowers for many, many years. We say a huge 'thank you' to Liz for all the dedication she has given to serving the parish with this particular gift she has.

New Date for Christmas Fair: it now takes place the weekend of 18 – 19th November. Please make a note of it!

Our Parish Liturgies: As you know we have a Liturgy Committee in the parish and this meets regularly. Their suggestions can help our celebrations. However, there is also another document that guides us: it is the *General Instruction for the Roman Missal* [or GIRM]. Gluten free hosts are now part of parish preparations in many places so, if there is a need for this, please see Fr Hugh.

How we celebrate and receive the Holy Eucharist is important. If we receive it on the tongue, the tongue goes *out!* If we receive it on the hand, the hand goes *out* as well! We do not snatch the Sacred Host but stretch our hands *out* and the minister places it on the palm of the communicant's hand. If we take the chalice, we are encouraged to *drink* the Sacred Wine. If the Precious Blood trickles down our chin, we may not be correctly doing what should be done. Please be attentive to how we receive the Holy Eucharist. At a weekday Mass, we hold the Sacred Host in the palm of our hands until we consume together. If you have any questions, please ask Fr Hugh.

100 Years Ago the battle of Passchendaele was taking place. During this past week, we've heard a lot about this anniversary and seen the Acts of Remembrance on TV. There were many heroic people who paid the ultimate price and died in fields far from their homelands. One of these was **Fr Willie Doyle SJ**. He was a WWI chaplain. "On 16th August, he was desperately trying to drag a wounded comrade back to safety from No Man's Land. He was blown to pieces by a shell. His remains were hastily interred in a makeshift communal grave." (Cath. Herald p 22 28 July 2017)
