In the Church of today we are **all** invited to be engaged in missionary work according to our different vocations and services. Nobody is dispensed from being a missionary disciple of Jesus and this is achieved in deeds, in prayer, in missionary support and concern for our world. Let us indeed pray to be more fervent in our missionary concerns and efforts.*

This weekend the parish welcomes Fr John Gerrard M Af (White Father) who comes on behalf of the White Fathers to make the annual mission appeal. The White Fathers serve in many places in the young Churches and have provided personnel and pastoral service ever since they were founded by Cardinal Lavignerie.
