28th Chrism Mass in Cathedral: this celebration is open to all. If anybody would like to accompany Fr Hugh, please get in touch with him. Lunch follows – for a small fee!

31st Family celebration of Reconciliation at 11.00am – new for us! It's an idea from our Liturgy Committee and we are ready for any good idea we get in the parish. Over to our families to try it.
