The Missionary Society of St. Columban and the Congregation of the Missionary Sisters of St Columban were born from the vision of two young priests whom Providence brought together in the years between 1916 and 1920. *Edward Galvin*, on loan from Cork to the Diocese of Brooklyn, New York, heard from a missionary about the religious situation in China and volunteered to go there himself in 1912. Four years later he returned to Ireland to seek the support of the Irish Church. *John Blowick*, who had recently been appointed to the faculty of St. Patrick's College, Maynooth, resigned his chair of theology to go to China as a missionary. The hopes of the two men converged in the vision of a new missionary family in the Church.

This Sunday the children go to parish rooms with the Catechists after the opening hymn and return at Offertory. We welcome Fr Denis Carter from the Columban Missionary Society; there will be a second collection after Communion.
