(2) The Report of 2016 speaks of repairs/improvements "as soon as possible". The expenses for both these items is close to £12,000.00 or more. Over the last 2 years, following on our parish consultation and, then, the open meeting last September, we know that there is no enthusiasm to raise funds for our Bakewell church so, sadly, it is now time for the next major decision viz. to move towards its closure and to provide pastorally for parishioners and visitors in Bakewell whilst there is a resident priest serving the parish. It will be a time for all of us to prepare for that future we have been speaking about

NOW for two years, together we will move to this future.
