**Monday's urgent meeting** has come about because of two important considerations: (1) an electrical inspection has to take place this year and we think it will fail this inspection and, therefore, major improvements will have to be undertaken. (2) The Report of 2016 speaks of repairs/improvements "as soon as possible". The expenses for both these items is close to £12,000.00 or more. Over the last 2 years, following on our parish consultation and, then, the open meeting last September, we know that there is no enthusiasm to raise funds for our Bakewell church so, sadly, it is now time for the next major decision viz. to move towards its closure and to provide pastorally for parishioners and visitors in Bakewell. It will be a time for all of us to prepare for that future we have been speaking about now for two years, together we will move to this future.

**Last Wednesday evening** Linda Brooks, Sarah Carter and Fr Hugh responded to the "call" of Bishop Patrick to come together to reflect on his Advent letter giving to us those three key words of **encounter, discipleship and missionary discipleship**. Ours was the last session and three others preceded it. Nearly 100 people were with us and it was an enjoyable and inspiring evening with the guest speaker being David Wells. Google him! You'll see a lot. David is a married layman with grown-up children and he travels about hoping to renew parishes and dioceses through his catechetical presentations.

**As far as we know** nobody represented our parish at last Tuesday's ecumenical meeting.

**Next Wednesday evening** the same three reps will attend the Deanery Pastoral Council to be held in Matlock. This will be another step on the way towards re-organising our parishes and Mass centres in the Deanery. It is an important pastoral initiative because the clergy would like to prepare for the time when there will be fewer Masses celebrated in our parishes.

**St Barnabas' Cathedral Nottingham** celebrates its 175<sup>th</sup> Anniversary this year (25 years younger than Hassop church!) and the plans are to have a flower festival in June with *every* parish contributing some display in the Cathedral. Hopefully, our flower arrangers will accept this invitation and challenge even to do something for the occasion ... and, yes, Nottingham is very far away!

**On Thursday afternoon** Clare McKenzie gave a presentation of Module 2 regarding *Safeguarding & Protecting the Young and Vulnerable*. This presentation was for clergy but she intends to do something similar for our parish Safeguarding reps and may visit our parish.

**Gestures at Mass** are considered *very* important. The Sign of Peace is done at the invitation of the celebrant; the Offertory baskets should be received and passed on by the members of the congregation, including those who support the parish through their personal bank arrangements.

**2019 Sunday Missals** are now available in both churches, thanks to Jane who got them for us. Only 10 copies were ordered; they cost £5.00 per copy – money in paper boxes.

**Monica Hickie's son** Nick Ward was found dead at the end of last week in his flat in Matlock. Felicity, Monica's daughter, is now trying to prepare funeral arrangements for her brother just a few months after doing the same for her Mother at the end of 2018. We remember Nick.
