Last Monday evening

we had what was the final meeting re the future of our Bakewell church. Thanks go to the 17 people who attended and to those who sent apologies for absence. Bill McDermott, Mike Watkiss, Juliet Peel and John Hespe all kindly agreed to help Fr Hugh in the preparations for the transition to a new arrangement in Bakewell. During this meeting, a few people raised the question of "risks" in continuing to use the Bakewell church believing that we may be placing ourselves and visitors at serious risk if we continue to keep it open until mid-year.

In the light of these possible risks leading to a serious situation (like an explosion), Fr Hugh had to consult the Diocese and their reply is that we must be ready to cease using the Bakewell church *immediately*. We will now have to come up with a more immediate plan and this will mean having the weekend Masses only in Hassop until we find a suitable arrangement in Bakewell. Obviously, some people will be upset with this unexpected decision but, because of the discussion last Monday evening, Fr Hugh was duty bound to consult with the Diocese and is as surprised as you are with their reply. This past week we have actively been in touch with the Methodist Church in Bakewell and the Friends' Meeting House to enquire about a future arrangement for Saturday evening Masses at 6.00pm with no first Sunday 'switch-over'.

Rev. Adrian Perry is the Methodist minister in Bakewell and a gifted musician. He is going ahead with plans to launch the *WILDFIRE* musical in summer 2019 – possibly 6 – 7th June. Rehearsals have begun already! He is still looking for participants. It would be a wonderful chance for some of our young parishioners to get involved with something ecumenical and enjoyable at the same time.
