On 'House Masses': "Because we no longer have a church in Bakewell itself, Fr Hugh has kindly provided the opportunity to attend a weekday Mass in Bakewell by holding a House Mass on Thursdays at 10.00 a.m. These are held on most Thursdays and take place in the homes of parishioners. They are well attended and open to EVERYONE in the parish. Venues are announced in the weekly bulletin." (CMF)

Yvette Jordan offers us this message re LPAs: 'Ever thought about what would happen if you had a serious accident, stroke or were housebound? Who would help you look after your finances? Banks will not deal with anyone unless they are an attorney on your Lasting Power of Attorney (LPA). If your income is less than £12,000 a year or are in receipt of certain benefits you may only have to pay half the LPA registration fee or even nothing at all, so don't let the £82 cost put you off having this vital deed to safeguard your future. Please take a leaflet from the back of the church and see Yvette Jordan for more details and help filling in the LPA forms. She deals with LPAs every day and will ensure you complete the form correctly, saving you extra cost or delays. Solicitors charge upwards of £1,500 for this service. Yvette will help you for a nominal fee.' Yvette is present most Sundays so feel free to contact her.

New Eucharistic Minister: This year one parishioner, Sarah Carter, has agreed to attend the training course. There is time for others to request information about this ministry and service in the parish.

In October Fr Hugh has to address the Council of Priests re the closure of our Bakewell church. This is a measure required by Canon Law and, after the final decision is recorded and an assurance of pastoral ministry for the people of Bakewell is given, the C of P will make its final decision for further action.

Bishop Patrick McKinney has been our Bishop for four years now. The Bishop came to us as a stranger from another diocese and he has assiduously visited the parishes and clergy of Nottingham Diocese. He is very conscious of the need to prepare for a future development in ministries and parish service. He recently met the Parish Catechists and on 12th October he will meet parish administrators from finance, PPC, (liturgy), health & safety with workshops in these "corners" of parish life. Bishop Patrick asks *every* parish to be represented. Can we rise to the challenge? Step forward brave souls who feel called to prepare for the new mission era our country now faces.

October – Month of Mission: Pope Francis has called on the whole Church to celebrate the "call of mission" in the month of October when we celebrate World Mission Sunday. Every year we are reminded in October of the *universal mission* of the Church. In little Hassop & Bakewell we have people from different countries gathering every week.
