31st: Day of prayer for the future of our country. Next Friday we have a short period of Adoration at 11.00am followed by Mass at 11.30. A number of clergy from different church communities have suggested that we hold a special time of prayer as the UK leaves the European Union and moves to an uncertain future.

World Day of Prayer: *Rise, take up your mat and walk!*

Friday 6th March, 2020, 2.30pm at All Saints' Church, Bakewell. Women of Zimbabwe have prepared this year's service. World Day of Prayer is an international, inter-church organisation which enables us to hear the thoughts of women from all parts of the world; their hopes, concerns and prayers. It is celebrated in 170 countries. It begins in Samoa and prayer in native languages travels through Asia, Africa, the Middle East, Europe and the Americas, before finishing in American Samoa more than 36 hours later. Men will be taking part in the service and all are welcome.

On Wednesday 19th February we are planning to have an open meeting – open for all parishioners who wish to attend. This replaces the PPC system that we had and we agreed for this new method at our AGM last October. The open meeting takes place in the presbytery at 7.00p m. Bill McDermott has kindly agreed to chair the meeting and prepare an agenda for us. If you have suggestions to make, please do so in good time and give to Bill.

One item discussed was our Bakewell church which is now definitely on the way to being sold following on *our* decisions at the open meetings **not** to go down the road of fundraising for two churches. The diocesan property office is handling the sale but some parishioners and Fr Hugh have been involved in handling moveable goods. If you want anything from the church, please let the office know. Benches can be bought; crockery and vases are there along with other non-liturgical goods.

Mick Allsop and John Hespe are willing to put some time into a "small" open house session in the Bakewell church if people wanted to give donations for benches, statues, crib figures, etc. The church is not very clean at present and it would need to be prepared. Sustainable Development Goals: Pope Francis published his encyclical '*Laudato Si'*' on Care for our Common Home. CAFOD supporters in Hallam and Nottingham Diocese are running an event to see how this plays out through the International Sustainable Development Goals or SDGs set by the UN, aimed to fight poverty and climate change by 2030. We have been invited to the event at St Joseph's in Matlock on Saturday 15th February, 11am – 3pm. The event is a multiplayer card game for everyone to stimulate discussion and raise awareness.
