In his homily on Ash Wednesday, the Pope reflected on ashes imposed on the foreheads of the faithful at the start of Lent. "We are dust in the universe," he said. "Yet we are dust loved by God." "We are God's hope, his treasure and his glory." Pope Francis went on to describe ashes as a reminder of the direction of our existence: "a passage from dust to life." But if we allow ourselves "to be shaped by the hands of God, we become something wonderful." Lent, he said, is a time of grace during which we can change our lives by letting God gaze upon us with love. Lent is a time of healing. *Taken from a report by Devin Watkins on vaticannews.va*
