In his article in last week's Catholic Herald, Bishop John Arnold draws our attention to our Catholic church's response to climate change and its accelerating damage to the planet. He highlights the impact of Greta Thunberg who speaks out with eloquence and conviction on behalf of the generation of young people, demonstrating a sensitivity for the glory of creation. Although she is not a catholic he believes that she speaks from the same foundation that we would share in our Catholic faith: that God created a world of infinite variety and fragile balance and it is left in our care as our common home. Bishop Arnold says that it is important that each and every one of us without exception changes our own everyday routines in order to safeguard the environment. He concludes: "Thank you, Greta, for helping us to become more aware of this aspect of the "missionary discipleship" of our Church.

This Wednesday 18th March, we'll be looking at the *Wisdom Literature* which includes books like Proverbs, Wisdom, etc., with Deacon Owen Le Blanc (High Peak Deanery). If you can, have a look at a text, this might help by way of preparation. Last Wednesday, we had about 20 people again – and this included a few visitors from another church community. On 25th March we have Sister Susan to look at the psalms which we say so often as part of the liturgy of the Word. Finally, we have Roland on 1st April reflecting on some of the prophets.

Coronavirus: Due to the evolving situation regarding Coronavirus, Bishop Patrick has issued guidelines on special pastoral measures to be implemented in our parishes effective from 9th March to 6th April. A copy can be found on the noticeboard at the back of the church. We have already introduced some of his measures, i.e., suspension of the sign of peace and communion from the chalice, and removal of holy water stoups. Hand washing and general hygiene measures are also listed and this we will continue to do. Please use the hand gels on the tables at the back of church as you enter. As hand gels seem to be in short supply, if anyone comes across these on their shopping trips it would be appreciated if you could get one or two for the church. We are also removing hymn books for the time being again in line with Bishop Patrick's letter. We continue to pray that efforts to control the spread of this virus are successful and for the recovery of those affected.
