Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter, *Motu proprio "Aperuit illis"*, was published on 30th September, and established that "the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the "celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God". Pope Francis invites local communities to find ways to "mark this Sunday with a certain solemnity".

Pope Francis states that The Bible is not for the privileged few but belongs "to those called to hear its message and to recognize themselves in its words". It is "the book of the Lord's people, who, in listening to it, move from dispersion and division towards unity". Since the Scriptures everywhere speak of Christ, he writes, "they enable us to believe that His death and resurrection are not myth but history, and are central to the faith of His disciples".

The Pope concludes by defining what he describes as "the great challenge before us in life: to listen to Sacred Scripture and then to practice mercy". God's Word, writes Pope Francis, "has the power to open our eyes and to enable us to renounce a stifling and barren individualism and instead to embark on a new path of sharing and solidarity". The individually-sealed booklets are being sent out to all parishes later this month and will then be distributed to our parishioners.

On Wednesday there will be the Quinquennial Inspection of church and presbytery arranged for by the Diocese. It happens about every 5 years – so our time is up!
